European Education and Training in Armaments Co-operation - The Way Ahead -

Conference overview

The conference will address key contextual issues surrounding the need for European education and training in armaments co-operation and outline the way ahead on how to make European education and training in armaments co-operation a working reality.

A welcome event will be held in the evening of 15 June with the main day of the conference on 16 June 2009. The opening address will be given by the Director of the Institute for Security Studies of the European Union (EU ISS), Álvaro de Vasconcelos, and address the inexorable melding of the civil, security and defence sectors through education.

After the keynote speech, the first panel will discuss "The Need for Education in European Armaments Co-operation," taking into account the results of the EU ISS Final Report "Enhancing the mutual understanding of stakeholders engaged in cooperative programmes" of 2008. Then it will give an overview of multinational and national education and training platforms mature enough to provide for European armaments education and training. Finally, it will articulate key principles that should guide the creation of this type of education.

The second panel, "A European Armaments Educational and Training Platform – Finding a Common Ground," will deal with the output of two preparatory workshops held in EDA on requirements and the overall concept of education in armaments co-operation. It will discuss how to integrate and join-up the existing education providers, EU institutions and industry into a coherent European armaments co-operation education project.

The closing session, "Enhancing Understanding of Armaments Co-operation in Europe through common Education and Training - The Way Ahead," will articulate the way forward on how to merge the needs for education in armaments co-operation with the providers of Education and training and on how to make it a working reality.
